

Helping Children Understand Language

- 1. Talk to infants and toddlers about the meals they are eating.
- 2. Point out and describe features of the toys children are playing with to all infants and toddlers.
- 3. Talk about the steps of the diapering process and engage in verbal play during the diaper change.
- 4. Talk playfully as the child is being bottle fed.
- 5. Talk about the events from the day.
- 6. Talk about and express interest in the art work children do.
- 7. Lift a child up to see the hanging displays and to talk about how it moves and what it looks like and what it does.
- 8. Communication is to be personalized and relate to immediate situation and at the right level to be understood by the child.
- 9. Staff is to use simple and descriptive words when playing with the children. "A hat. You put on the hat. I am wearing a hat, too!"
- Staff is to use a wide range of simple and exact words to describe children's experiences as they engage in play and observe the world around them.
- 11. Staff and children enjoy verbal play such as imitating sounds, singing songs, rhyming words and repeating rhymes.
