## 220.11 School Readiness and VPK Providers Compliance Policy

### **POLICY:**

The Coalition will ensure that all Providers under contract with the Early Learning Coalition will comply with applicable Florida laws, rules, and regulations and the Provider Contracts 6M-4.610 Form OEL SR-20 and 6M-8.301 Form OEL-VPK-20.

The Coalition will ensure provider's ability to meet the conditions of their contract through completion of initial and subsequent developmental screenings in accordance with Rule 6M-4.720, F.A.C. The Coalition will provide training for new providers on the use of the Single Statewide Information System to complete child screenings and follow-up activities if needed for children showing concerns.

#### **Definitions:**

<u>Concerns</u>: A child scoring below established thresholds or age-appropriate levels suggested by the authors of a screening instrument.

<u>Enrollment</u>: The final step in the process of entering (or enrolling) a child in the School Readiness program.

<u>Provider</u>: One who delivers child care services, specifically: a child care facility, family child care home, large family child care home, public or nonpublic school exempt from licensure, a faith-based child care program exempt from licensure, a before or afterschool program, or an informal child care as authorized by law. (6M-4.610 F.A.C)

<u>School Readiness</u>: The School Readiness Act was passed by the Florida Legislature to help children from low-income families get the support they need to be successful in school. The program provides child care so a parent can work or attend a training or education program. The program is funded primarily by a federal Child Care and Development Fund Block Grant. It is administered at the state level by the Office of Early Learning. <u>Screener</u>: The individual responsible for conducting the developmental screening for each child.

<u>Screening</u>: The activities to identify children who may have concerns and who may need early intervention practices as supports.

## Single Statewide Information System (SSIS):

The designated system used to conduct screenings and provide screening information to early learning coalitions, parents and providers, consisting of the Family Portal, Provider Services Portal, and Coalition Services Portal.
