GUIDE FOR SANITIZING OR DISINFECTING



What is the difference between sanitizing and disinfecting?

SANITIZING PROCEDURES

AREAS: Food Contact Surface Areas (tables, dishes, utensils, highchair trays, toys that children may place in their mouths, and pacifiers)

1. Clean using a soapy water solution applied as a spray and wiped with a disposable paper towel.



- 2. <u>Sanitize</u> using a solution such as bleach/water applied as a spray (1 Tablespoon of bleach + 1 gallon of cool water) or with an *EPA sanitizer.
- 3. Let stand for 2 minutes or allow to air dry.
- *Only a sanitizing product with an EPA registration number on the label can be used in exchange for bleach/water. The manufacturer's instructions must be followed as specified on the label.



DISINFECTING PROCEDURES

AREAS: Toilet and Diapering Areas (non-porous surfaces such as diaper changing tables, counter tops, toilets and potty chairs, door and cabinet handles, diaper pails, hand washing sinks and faucets)

- **1**. Clean using a soapy water solution applied as a spray and wiped with a disposable paper towel.
- 2. <u>Disinfect</u> using a solution such as bleach/water applied as a spray (1-3 Tablespoon of bleach + 1 quart of cool water) or with an *EPA disinfectant.
- **3**. Let stand for 2 minutes or allow to air dry.
- *Only a disinfecting product with an EPA registration number on the label can be used in exchange for bleach/water. The manufacturer's instructions must be followed as specified on the label.
