

## WHEN TO NOTIFY PARENTS AND CONTACT THE ELC HEALTH NURSE OR THE LOCAL HEALTH DEPARTMENT

*When one or more children attending a child care setting are diagnosed with any of the following diseases, you need to contact your ELC nurse or the local health department.*

- **Amebiasis**
- **Bacterial Meningitis**
- **Campylobacteriosis**
- **Mumps**
- **Pertussis (Whooping Cough)**
- **Cryptosporidiosis**
- **Diphtheria**
- **E. coli 0157:H7**
- **Giardia**
- **Salmonellosis**
- **Hepatitis A**
- **Hepatitis B**
- **HIV (AIDS)**
- **Measles**
- **Polio**
- **Rubella**
- **Shigella**
- **Chickenpox (Varicella)**
- **Tuberculosis**

It is essential to notify the health department or the ELC nurse immediately when a child in a child care setting has a serious infectious disease.
